## FOREIGN LANGUAGES AND LITERATURE, BACHELOR OF ARTS

To obtain a B.A. with a major in Foreign Languages and Literature, a student must fulfill university, college, and departmental requirements. Hour requirements follow:

- 46 hours of University General Education courses
- 16 hours of foreign languages (elementary and intermediate)
- 12-19 hours college breadth requirement
- 30-31 hours of major courses
- 9-16 hours of electives


## TOTAL HOURS: 120

Students with a concentration in French, German, or Spanish take the following:

- 3 hours in Conversation (FREN 3030, GERM 3030, SPAN 3030 or SPAN 3010)
- 6 hours in Grammar, Composition, and Stylistics (FREN 3040 and FREN 4040; GERM 3040 and GERM 4040; SPAN 3040 or SPAN 3020 and SPAN 4040)
- 3 hours in Readings (FREN 3060, GERM 3060, or SPAN 3060)
- 18 hours of electives chosen from three tracks:
- Literature and Film
- Culture and Society
- Linguistics and Language for the Professions.

A minimum of 3 hours must be taken within each of the three tracks. As long as students complete at least 3 hours in each track, they may fulfill their elective course requirements in whichever track or tracks they choose.

A total of 30 upper-division (3000-4000 level) credit hours is required.
It is strongly recommended that all foreign language majors include a study abroad component of at least one month during the second half of their program of study. All courses credited to a major or minor in a foreign language must be passed with a grade of "C-" or better.

Students with a concentration in Spanish for Health Sciences take the following:

- 1 hour in Introduction to Spanish for Health Sciences (SPAN 1140)
- 3 hours in Conversation (SPAN 3030 or SPAN 3010)
- 3 hours in Grammar and Composition (SPAN 3040 or SPAN 3020)
- 3 hours in Readings (SPAN 3060)
- 3 hours in Spanish for Healthcare Professionals or Latin America in Context (SPAN 3570 or SPAN 3050)
- 3 hours in Linguistic Justice and Latino Health or in Linguistics and Language for the Professions (SPAN 4330 or SPAN 4970)
- 3 hours in Internship in Spanish (SPAN 4800)

12 hours of electives. Elective courses include SPAN 3050 or SPAN 3570, SPAN 4060, SPAN 3420, SPAN 4030, SPAN 4130, SPAN 4330 or SPAN 4970, SPAN 4950, SPAN 4960.

In addition to SPAN 1140 (1 credit hour), a total of 30 upper-division (3000-4000 level) credit hours is required.

It is strongly recommended that all foreign language majors include a study abroad component of at least one month during the second half of their
program of study. All courses credited to a major or minor in a foreign language must be passed with a grade of "C-" or better.
